#### WHAT TO BRING

Don't stress out about your clothing choices. Keeping in mind that the Philippines is a tropical archipelago with almost-constant temperatures all year round, light summer clothing should suffice. Choose items that are comfortable and breathable.

Having a light rain jacket handy is also a good idea - you never know when a storm will pop up, and you'll need long sleeves to enter a church.

Make sure to bring your camera to capture the unmatched scenery. It is truly incredible and the adventure activities are an absolute thrill! In addition to that, remember to bring sunscreen, a snorkeling mask, and a dry bag to store all your belongings. If you are going to the beach or doing sea activities, you will find the latter extremely useful.



#### **GETTING AROUND**

The most convenient way of getting around most towns is either by tricycle or a jeepney - the ubiquitous, vibranthued buses that are the most popular means of public transportation in the Philippines. Depending on where you are going, budget flights are also an option for wallet-friendly travel between cities. Travelers can also consider hiring private cars or motorcycles to get around.

# MAP OF CAMIGUIN (WATER AND LAND ACTIVITIES)





#### White Island

White Island is an uninhabited sandbar off the coast of Camiguin Island that is untouched by humans. The horse-shaped island is home to toe-sinking sandy beaches and enveloped by turquoise waters.

#### **How to Get There**

The only way to get to White Island is by a pump boat from Mambajao, off the main island. An entrance fee of P50 also applies as an entrance fee.





#### **Mantigue Island**

The underwater sanctuary is rich and thriving and divers are guaranteed to spot a sea turtle on their dive. Aside from turtles, divers can encounter ribbon eels, trumpetfish, pufferfish, boxfish, parrotfish, frogfish, barracudas, batfish, sweetlips, and even rays and blacktip sharks.

#### **How to Get There**

Take a boat from Camiguin Island to Mantigue Island. The ride should last around 45 minutes.

#### **Kibila White Beach**

Kibila White Beach is home to magnificent giant clams. These clams thrive in the colorful reefs on the island and learn about the conservation efforts to protect these vulnerable marine species.

#### **How to Get There**

Hire a motorcycle from Mambajao to get to Kibila White Beach and drive down for around 15 minutes.

What to See and Do?




#### **Tuasan Falls**

Tucked away in a lush forest, Tuasan Falls is almost unnoticeable from the streets. The 20-meter tall waterfall is fascinating and its jungle landscape makes you feel one with nature. The bottom pool dives into two and is also fed by chilly mountain water that keeps the pool cold all year round.

#### **How to Get There**

The best way to get to Tuasan Falls is to rent a scooter but you may also hire a tricycle with a driver to bring you there.



#### Katibawasan Falls

Standing at a monumental 70-meter height, this waterfall is the tallest one on Camiguin Island. The pool at the bottom of the waterfall is cold and often perfect to cool in the tropical heat. To get down there, there is a short flight of stairs to follow that leads to the stunning waterfall.

#### **How to Get There**


You can rent a scooter or hire a jeepney or tricycle to get around Camiguin Island. From Mambajao, the ride is around 20 minutes to the waterfall.

#### Mt. Hibok-Hibok

The stratovolcano stands at an elevation of 1,332 meters above sea level and sits on Camiguin Island. It is a popular hiking trail and from the peak, hikers can see the other provinces of the Philippines including Bohol and Siquijor. Along the way, hikers can spot statues depicting the Roman Catholic Stations of the Cross.

#### **How to Get There**

The usual starting point for this climb is from Ardent Hot Springs, which is located 10-minutes from tourist beaches.





## GO LOCAL - OFF THE BEATEN TRACK




#### **Sunken Cemetery**

Located off the coast of Cagayan de Oro, the Sunken Cemetery in Catarman is one of the most prominent destinations on Camiguin Island and home to the first settlers who were buried alive after Mount Vulcan erupted. These underwater tombstones emerge from the water during low tides.

#### **How to Get There**

Visitors can rent a scooter from tourist hotspot Mambajao and drive down to the Sunken Cemetery. The drive last around 30 minutes.







#### **Old Bonbon Church Ruins of Catarman**

Destroyed by volcanic eruptions from 1871 to 1875, the church is partially stained with volcanic debris and rubble. The bell tower to the church remains standing, and the only one in the town to do so.

#### **How to Get There**

The ruins are located near the Sunken Cemetery, a neighboring site that was also affected by the eruption.



#### **Santo Rosario Church**

Built in 1882, the church is also known as "Green Church". Its rustic and worn-down facade does not diminish its reputation and is strong evidence of Spanish influence on Camiguin Island.

#### **How to Get There**

The ruins are located in southern Camiguin Island.

#### San Nicolas de Tolentino Parish

San Nicolas de Tolentino Parish holds a reputation as a miracle church as it is believed to have been a safe house for people during the eruption of Mt. Hibok-Hibok.

#### **How to Get There**

The church is located on the northern tip of Camiguin Island.

#### **Lanzones Festival**

Lanzones Festival celebrates the harvest of the lanzones fruit (or longkang). The festive week sees street dancing, parades and beauty pageant performances.

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## BEACHES OF VIGAN

#### **Mindoro Beach**

Not to be confused with Mindoro province, this popular beach in Vigan is lined with cottages for an island-like getaway and small stores to purchase a snack. Fine sand and the salt breeze greet beachgoers as they bask in the tropical sun.

#### **How to Get There**

From Mindoro Airport, travel to Barangay Mindoro via a private or public commute. At the beach, there is free parking available.





#### Sta. Catalina Beach

Stretches of black sand and interesting rock formations by the beach make this a popular hideout. Sta. Catalina beach is mostly known to locals but this hidden spot is a blissful getaway.

#### **How to Get There**

The easiest way to get there is in a private vehicle.

## DIVE IN VIGAN

#### **Apatot Shipwreck**

This is an easy wreck and suitable for beginner wreck divers as well. The ship sits on the shallow sea bed and can be observed from its exteriors. It is found around 200 meters from the shore and its deepest point is 15 meters.





#### **Grotto Special**

A colorful reef brimming with an abundance of vibrant fishes and healthy corals, Grotto Special is a dive site for all. Divers can observe macro critters as well as red snappers along the dive.

## NATURE

#### **Baluarte Zoo**

Baluarte Zoo is a vast land of roughly 100 hectares. It was opened by former governor Chavit Singson who wanted to share his love for nature and wildlife.

#### **How to Get There**

The zoo has no entrance fees and locals and tourists can enter at a rate of P50. Take a 10-minute transport from the city center to arrive at Baluarte Zoo.







#### **Ilocos Sur Adventure Zone**

Pump your adrenaline at Vigan's adventure hotspot, Ilocos Sur Adventure Zone. Enjoy thrilling activities with a view of the island's natural landscape and untouched beauty.

#### **How to Get There**

Ilocos Sur Adventure Zone is around 15 minutes away from the city center and can be reached by private or public transport.



## GO LOCAL-OFF THE BEATEN TRACK





#### Pagburnayan

Learn the art of pottery and Filipino history with Vigan's bustling pottery industry. The importance and inclusion of clay jars in Filipino culture and culinary roots are highlighted in this off the beaten path activity.



#### **Quema House**

A historic landmark in Vigan, the Quema House is an ancestral home and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It is a planned Spanish colonial town, reflecting Chinese and European elements paired with Filipino culture.





#### **Bantay Church Bell Tower**

An iconic symbol of Vigan, the Bantay Church Bell Tower is a watchtower-turned-bell-tower built in 1591.

#### **How to Get There**

From Vigan, the bell tower is a 10-minute ride away and visitors need to head up a long flight of stairs on a small hill.







#### April

#### **World Costume Festival**

Celebrated in the last week of April, the World Costume Festival is held in the city of Vigan every two years. Indigenous people and modern performances, drama, as well as customary rituals, are organised.



## FOOD

The capital of Ilocos Sur, Vigan is well known for its delightful cuisines that are made for everyone's taste buds.

#### >> Bagnet

Bagnet (boiled and deep-fried pork belly) is crunchy on the outside and complete when dipped in vinegar.



#### >> Empanada

Another mouth watering snack is the empanada. Stuffed with green papaya, bean sprouts, carrots, eggs and longanisa, this patty is delicious inside and outside.





## << Vigan Longganisa

Another dish is Vigan Longanisa – a round native sausage with an overpowering garlic flavor. It is usually served during breakfast, alongside fried eggs, and dropped in local Ilocos vinegar.



## << Vigan Miki

Streetfood is a hit in Vigan and you shouldn't miss out on Vigan Miki. This savory chicken noodle soup, which includes hand-made Miki noodles, is a vibrant orange-red dish.
